<p>BowlSafe dated 18 June 2020 version 1.31</p> <p>On page 6 Point 4.1 -</p> <p>c. Safe distancing – although bowling is a non-contact sport, safe distancing will be required along with the compulsory wearing of mask</p> <p>i. Lane allocation for casual walk-in players should be limited to the following to enable safe distancing of 2m between players. Each bowling centre is required to work out its own lane allocation and maximum number of bowlers per lanes/pair based on the safe distancing requirement. For SBRR @ Temasek Club it shall be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two (2) persons to a lane with clear instructions on where the bowlers should sit or stand in order to maintain 2m distance from each other. Lane allocation for casual walk-in players should be limited to the following to enable safe distancing of 2m between players. Each bowling centre is required to work out its own lane allocation and maximum number of bowlers per lanes/pair based on the safe distancing requirement. For SBRR @ Temasek Club it shall be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Two (2) persons to a lane with clear instructions on where the bowlers should sit or stand in order to maintain 2m distance from each other. An exception would be allowed for groups of people that stay within the same household – up to five (5) persons per pair of lanes. • The lane allocation should provide a one-lane buffer between different groups of bowlers to ensure safe distancing between different groups of bowlers (note – more than one bowler is considered a group).

Guests are to be reminded not to share equipment.</p>	<p>BowlSafe dated 22 June 2020 version 1.4</p> <p>On page 5 Point 4.1 b iii -</p> <p>Shoes and house balls should be issued (versus guest choosing ball from a rack) and disinfected after use using solutions which are capable of killing bacteria and viruses. Guests are to be reminded not to share equipment.</p> <p>Or if this cannot be done:</p> <p>Shoes and house balls should be cleaned daily before and after operations using cleaning agents which are capable of killing bacteria and viruses. When bowlers come to the counter, they will be asked to sanitize their hands before choosing a ball from the ball racks and bring it to the counter to be sanitized before use (finger holes and ball surface). Bowler will then sanitize hands before play. At the end of play, bowler leaves the ball on the Ball Return and bowling centre staff will sanitize the ball (finger holes and ball surface) before returning it to ball rack. Guests are to be reminded not to share equipment.</p>
