

## Rules & Regulations

### 1. OBJECTIVES

- 1.1 The objective of the Own Time Virtual Competition II (OTVT2) is to foster and promote goodwill, comradeship, friendship & sportsmanship amongst the local bowling fraternity.
- 1.2 This virtual tournament will be held from 28 November to 20 December 2020 (Qualifying period) at participating bowling centres (Refer to point 9 for list of participating centres), and 21 - 23, 28 - 30 December 2020 (Masters) at SingaporeBowling @ Rifle Range.

### 2. ELIGIBILITY

- 2.1 The Tournament is open to all residents in Singapore, each of which must individually and collectively qualify under the Rules & Regulations of this tournament (International Bowling Federation, also known as IBF, General Playing Rules as guide). It is the bowler's responsibility to check the status of eligibility. No refunds/transfer of scores will be allowed in the event of ineligibility discovered after commencement of attempts.

### 3. CLASSIFICATION / DIVISION

#### 3.1 Singles (Gender Specific):

- **Open:** All male and female bowlers, regardless of age are eligible to participate in this division.
- **Senior:** All male and female bowlers, who are **born in year 1970 and before.**
- **Graded:** All male and female bowlers, regardless of age, who are not National Bowlers between 2018 – 2020, and have not been in Top 5 positions of any of the Graded/Graded 'A'/Seniors/Open divisions of any SBF organised tournaments between 2018 - 2020, are eligible to participate in this division.
- **Youth:** All boys and girls who are **born in year 1999 and after.**
- **Under 16:** All boys and girls who are **born in year 2004 and after.**
- **Under 12:** All boys and girls who are **born in year 2008 and after.**
- **Handicap:**
  - All Current National Bowler: -5 pins per game
  - Seniors: See Page 4 for Seniors Handicap Chart, applicable per game.

#### 3.2 Mixed Doubles Event:

- The Division classifications will be as above. **Bowlers may only form 1 Team per division.**
- Teams can be formed with 2 bowlers of the same/different gender, and both bowlers must bowl together for their Team attempt. Substitutions are not allowed.
- **Handicap:**
  - Male Current National Bowler: -5 pins per game
  - Female Current National Bowler: Bowl scratch
  - Female Bowlers: +7 pins per game
  - Seniors: See Page 4 for Seniors Handicap Chart, applicable per game

### 4. REGISTRATION OF ENTRIES

- 4.1 Registration & payment (per participating event/division) can be done directly at any one of the participating centres, prior to making the attempt.  
*Example: Registrant wishes to take part in the Singles Under 16 (\$30), Doubles Youth (\$40/team) and Singles Open Divisions (\$50), he will need to pay a total of \$100 for registration of 3 divisions:  
\$30 (U16) + \$40/2 (Youth) + \$50 (Open)*
- 4.2 **Registering for only the Doubles Event is not allowed. Participants MUST register for at least one of the Singles Event division before they can register for any Mixed Doubles Event (Need not be the same division for both).**
- 4.3 Participants will need to fill up the registration form via a google form that will be provided at the administering bowling centre.
- 4.4 Mode of payment for registration: ONLY e-NETS QR / Use your preferred bank app and scan the QR code to make the payment. NO CASH PAYMENT.
- 4.5 No refund shall be made after an entry has been registered and accepted.

### 5. GAME FEES

- 5.1 Game Fees are payable directly to the participating bowling centre that the participant is bowling at, subject to their mode of payments.

#### GAME FEES (Per attempt - 3-games series):

U12 / U16 / Youth	\$20/pax	\$40/team
Graded / Senior / Open	\$25/pax	\$50/team

### 6. FORMAT OF PLAY (SINGLES)

#### 6.1 SINGLES EVENT (Gender Specific)

- 6.1.1 The qualifying scores will be based on the best attempt at two (2) different participating centres (1 best attempt x 2 centres = total of 6 games), to be place in the qualifiers ranking, for the respective classifications.
- 6.1.2 Each attempt consists of a 3-game series, played on open-lane (no cross lane) with three (3) minutes practice time per bowler.
- 6.1.3 Bowlers will have to bowl at minimum of two (2) different participating centres, one (1) of which must be at SingaporeBowling @ Rifle Range. The other centre will be of the bowler's choice to choose from, which may be of different lane conditions. Bowler may choose to make attempts at more than one (1) other participating centres. Refer to Annex for List of Participating Centres.
- 6.1.4 Best attempt from one other centre + best attempt from SBRR to determine the bowler's best of 6 games total pinfalls for Masters Qualifiers.  
*(1 best attempt x 2 centres = total of 6 games), which will then be ranked on the Masters Qualifiers for the respective division/gender.*
- 6.1.5 At the end of the qualifying period, Top 16 from each division/gender will proceed to a Masters Event, and the Top 4 seeds from Masters Event will proceed into a Step Ladder Event which will be live streamed on SBF's Facebook Page. In the event if there are less than 18 participants for a gender specific division, a 'minus 2 rule' applies, i.e bottom 2 positions will not qualify.  
*For example: If there are only 18 participants for Women's Open, then Top 16 will qualify as usual. However, if there are only 17 participants, then only Top 15 will qualify. If there are only 10 participants, then only Top 8 will qualify.*

#### 6.2 MIXED DOUBLES EVENT

- 6.2.1 The qualifying scores will be based on the best attempt at two (2) different participating centres (1 best attempt x 2 centres x 2 bowlers = total of 12 games), to be place in the qualifiers ranking, for the respective classifications
- 6.2.2 Each attempt consists of a 3-game series x 2 bowlers per team, played on open-lane (no cross lane) with five (5) minutes practice time per team.
- 6.2.3 Teams will have to bowl at min. two (2) different participating centres, one (1) of which must be at SingaporeBowling @ Rifle Range. The other centre will be of the team's choice to choose from, which may be of different lane conditions. Teams may choose to make attempts at more than one (1) other participating centres. Refer to Annex for List of Participating Centres.
- 6.2.4 Team's best attempt from one other centre + best attempt from SBRR to determine the team's best of 12 games total pinfalls for Masters Qualifiers.  
*(1 best attempt x 2 centres = total of 12 games), will then be ranked on the Masters Qualifiers for the respective division.*
- 6.2.5 At the end of the qualifying period, Top 16 teams from each division will proceed to a Masters Finals event. In the event if there are less than 18 teams for a division, a 'minus 2 rule' applies, i.e bottom 2 positions will not qualify.  
*For example: If there are only 18 Teams for Women's Open, then Top 16 teams will qualify as usual. However, if there are only 17 teams, then only Top 15 teams will qualify. If there are only 10 teams, then only Top 8 teams will qualify.*

**6.2.6 Bowlers must have made their attempts for the Singles event in order to be able to qualify for the Doubles event.**

#### 6.3 APPLICABLE TO BOTH SINGLES & MIXED DOUBLES EVENTS

- 6.3.1 Bowlers will have unlimited tries to obtain their best attempt at the participating centres, during the duration of the Masters Qualifying period from 28 November to 20 December 2020. Maximum of 2 participants/1 Team is allowed per lane. Bowling centres are allowed to pair 2 individuals onto a same lane as per reflected in BowlSafe v1.6.
- 6.3.2 Each attempt will only be applicable for one (1) registered division/event, pre-decided prior to commencement of the attempt.  
*Example: If participant registers for Singles U16 & Doubles Open, he/she will need to state, prior to commencement of the attempt, the division/event the attempt is meant for. No changes will be allowed after commencement.*
- 6.3.3 Participants are advised to call up the bowling centre in advance to check on availability before heading to the venue. More info can be found in the Annex 'List of Participating Centres.'
- 6.3.4 Do note that different centres may have different oiling frequencies. Please check directly with the centre on their oiling frequency, and refer to our website's link for oiling patterns.
- 6.3.5 The last attempt on 20 December 2020 (Sunday) must commence latest by 8.30pm and scores will need to be submitted to SBF by 10.30pm. Masters qualifying standings will be published by 12.00am of 21 December 2020, Monday.
- 6.3.6 Masters event will be held at SingaporeBowling @ Rifle Range, between 21-23 & 28-30 December 2020, 12pm – 12am. Refer to [page 4](#) for Masters Schedule & Info.

## Rules & Regulations

### 7. MASTERS EVENT - HELD AT SINGAPOREBOWLING @ RIFLE RANGE

#### 7.1 Schedule – See Page 4

#### 7.2 Check-in Procedure

All finalists are to check-in personally at the tournament desk at least 30 minutes before the scheduled time for the Masters Event, failing which he/she/the team will be disqualified and the respective reserve(s) shall be called.

Calls will be made as follows:

1st Call: 3 minutes prior to Check-in time

2nd Call: 2 minutes prior to Check-in time

3rd Call: 1 minute prior to Check-in time

The clock in the bowling centre will be the official timepiece. Please buffer extra time for temperature screenings/Safe Entry check-ins. Lane Draw for the 1<sup>st</sup> block will be done upon the bowler's or team's check-in, on a first-come, first-served basis.

#### 7.3 Masters Fees

All Masters Finalists will be subjected to a separate Masters Fees as follow

#### 7.4 Masters Event Format (SINGLES)

All Masters Finalists will be required to play 2 blocks of 4 games. Both blocks will be of different oiling pattern, with NO LANE CHANGE within each block. A lane draw will be done for each block, ensuring that if the finalist were to be playing on the left half of the lanes for Block 1, he/she will then play on the right half of the lanes for Block 2. The total 8 games combined pinfalls will determine the final positions for 5<sup>th</sup> placing onwards, and the Top 4 bowlers will then proceed to the Step Ladder Event.

Step Ladder Event (Will be live streamed on Facebook)

The 1<sup>st</sup> placed bowler from Masters Event will get to decide the oiling pattern (Between Athens & Tokyo) for the Step Ladder Event, which will be applicable to the Quarter, Semi & Grand Finals.

- Quarter Final - #4 vs #3. Bowlers will bowl one game each. The Winner with the higher score will advance to Semi Final, and the Non-winner's position will be finalized at 4<sup>th</sup>.
- Semi Final – Winner of Quarter Final vs #2. Bowlers will bowl one game each. The Winner with the higher score will advance to Grand Final, and the Non-winner's position will be finalized at 3<sup>rd</sup>.
- Grand Final – Winner of Semi Final vs #1. Bowlers will bowl one game each. The Winner with the higher score will be declared the Champion, and the Non-winner's position will be finalized at 2<sup>nd</sup>.

We seek cooperation for all finalists to clear the bowler's area after finish playing each block, so that the centre's staff can proceed to wipe down the area before commence of the next block.

#### 7.5 Masters Event Format (MIXED DOUBLES)

All Masters Finalist teams will be required to play 2 blocks of 4 games x 2 bowlers/team. Both blocks will be of different oiling pattern, with NO LANE CHANGE within each block. A lane draw will be done for each block, ensuring that if the team were to be playing on the left half of the lanes for Block 1, they will then play on the right half of the lanes for Block 2. The total 16 games combined pinfalls will determine the final positions.

### 8. TIE – BREAKING PROCEDURES

- 8.1 When a tie is registered in the Masters Qualifiers, the player with the highest game, in the qualifying series, shall be the winner. If this still ends in a tie, the next high game will be counted, and / or repeated until the tie is broken
- 8.2 When a tie is registered in the Masters Finals, the player with the highest game, in the Masters Finals series, shall be the winner. If this still ends in a tie, the next high game will be counted, and/or repeated until the tie is broken.
- 8.3 When a tie is registered in the Step Ladder Event, a 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> frame roll-off shall be used, and/or repeated until the tie is broken

  - NSRCC Resort Bowl @ National Service Resort & Country Club
  - Seletar Bowl @ Seletar Country Club
  - Westwood Bowl @ Civil Service Club

### 10. SUBMISSION OF SCORES

10.1 All scratch system scores will be submitted to SBF by the participating centres, and must be verified by the participant as well.

10.2 System scores MUST reflect the **Registration Number, Division & Name**

10.3 Participants are also advised to take a screenshot of their scratch system scores for their own recording purposes.

10.4 Scores published online will then reflect with handicap (if any).

### 11. AVERAGES

11.1 All scores achieved from this tournament WILL NOT be recorded into SBF's National Averages System.

### 12. COVID-19 BOWLSAFE MEASURES

12.1 The tournament shall be carried out with safe distancing measures as outlined in the BowlSafe Guidelines approved by Sport Singapore.

Bowlers are also reminded to:

- No crossing of lanes.
- Ensure that a face mask is properly worn, covering the nose and mouth with an effective seal, at all times when bowling.
- Scan the Safe Entry QR codes to check-in/check-out at the respective bowling centres
- Ensure temperature is taken, seek medical help if you unwell and refrain from bowling
- Maintain safe distancing with another bowler
- Practice good hygiene, frequent use of hand sanitizer
- Avoid all forms of physical contact, e.g. high fives, fist bumps etc.

Participating centres have the right to refuse entry if bowlers are found to display any of the Covid-19 symptoms (coughing, sneezing, difficulty in breathing)

### 13. PRIZES/TROPHIES

13.1 Prizes in the form of Cash Vouchers/Cheques and trophies (Top 3 only) will be awarded to the winners of the various divisions/gender from the Masters Event and/or Step Ladder Event, and cannot be exchanged.

13.2 There shall be no SBF Perfect Games / High Game awards throughout the Tournament. Bowling Centre House Awards DO NOT APPLY as well.

13.3 (For Singles - Youth Girls, Graded, Senior & Women's Open Divisions)

In the event if there are less than 8 Master Finalists, a 'minus 2 rule' applies, i.e. the bottom 2 positions will not be awarded with any prize money.

For example: If there are only 8 Masters Finalists for Women's Open, then Top 6 positions will be awarded the prize money as per normal. However, if there are only 7 Masters Finalists, then only the Top 5 positions will be awarded the prize money.

13.4 (For Singles - U12, U16, Youth Boys, Men's Open Divisions, & all Mixed Doubles Divisions)

In the event if there are less than 10 Master Finalists, a 'minus 2 rule' applies, i.e. the bottom 2 positions will not be awarded with any prize money.

For example: If there are only 10 Masters Finalists for Women's Open, then Top 8 positions will be awarded the prize money as per normal. However, if there are only 9 Masters Finalists, then only the Top 7 positions will be awarded the prize money.

## Rules & Regulations

### 14. Bowler's Attire

- 14.1 Bowlers are required to be properly and appropriately dressed for bowling. If, in the opinion of the Tournament Director a bowler is not appropriately dressed, he/she may not be permitted to bowl. Male bowlers must wear pants or slacks and are not allowed to wear sleeveless shirts and/or shorts, Bermuda's; female bowlers may wear skirts, shorts, pants, slacks or dress shorts.  
ALL BOWLERS ARE NOT ALLOWED TO WEAR JEANS.
- 14.2 In the event of TV coverage, it is the prerogative of the Tournament Manager to stipulate the attire to be worn.  
In the event of TV coverage for the Step-Ladder Event, 14.1 still applies. However, the bowler may choose to wear his/her own shirt or accept an offer from the host to use a sponsor shirt or badge from the host sponsor.

### 15. BOWLING BALLS

- 15.1 It is the bowler's responsibility to ensure that all bowling balls used during the tournament are verified for correctness of weight and other specifications conforming to IBF Rules and Regulations. The tournament director reserves the right to examine the balls used by the participants. Use of an illegal ball is grounds for disqualification and forfeiture of all games, prizes and standings aside from any other penalties that may be imposed.
- 15.2 Altering the surface of the bowling ball is only allowed before commencement/after completion of each game, provided they are made at the designated area and it must not delay the bowlers and the progress of the game.
- 15.3 The specification eliminating the use of balance holes will be in effect for this tournament.

### 16. SLOW BOWLING

- Slow bowling is not allowed and bowlers must bowl when it is their turn to do so. Players preparing to step on the approach and deliver a ball shall have the following rights and obligations:
- 16.1 They may claim right of way only over a player moving to the approach on preparing to bowl on the lane immediately to their left.
- 16.2 They shall yield to a player moving to the approach or preparing to bowl on the lane immediately on their right.
- 16.3 They shall be ready to bowl when it is their turn and shall not delay the start of their approach or delivery if the lanes immediately adjacent to them on both the right and left are clear.
- 16.4 A player is given 30 seconds from the moment the previous bowler steps down from the approach to the time the ball leaves the hand of the bowler. Lane marshals will be given stop watches to randomly check the timing of the bowlers in their delivery.
- 16.5 If a player does not observe the procedures outlined in clause 14, it may be construed as slow bowling. A player failing to observe these procedures shall be warned by an authorized tournament official as follows:
- 16.6 A white card for the first offence (no penalty)
- 16.7 A yellow card for the second offence (no penalty)
- 16.8 Red card for the third and succeeding offence in any block of games, penalty shall be zero pinfalls for the frame.

### 17. INTERRUPTED GAME(S)

- 17.1 The tournament director may authorize the completion of a game and series on another pair of lanes when equipment failure on the lanes would delay the normal progress of the series. An interrupted game and series that cannot be completed must resume from the point of interruption.
- 17.2 In the event of the score of any game is lost and/or erased and cannot be recalled and/or traced due to power or equipment failure, the bowler concerned will be required to re-bowl a new game when the power supply resumes or equipment is repaired. However, all scores of completed games that have been recorded in the official score sheet shall remain unchanged.

### 18. Verification of Scores

It is the bowler's responsibility to ensure that the correct score for each game bowled is recorded and signed on the official score sheet, which will be used as the official score record. Once signed, the scores shall stand unless otherwise decided by the Bowling Centre Manager / Tournament Official. If the official score sheet is not signed for any reason, the Tournament Official reserves the right to refuse acceptance of the score sheet.

### 19. LANE BREAKDOWN

- 19.1 If a pair of lanes becomes unusable or unplayable before or during the squad games as determined by the tournament director or its assigned official, any available pair of lanes provided by the bowling centre shall be assigned to affected participant(s) or shall wait for the next available squad. Any interrupted game(s) or series must resume from the point (frame) of interruption. Practice throws (if any) shall be given at the discretion of the Participating Centre Manager. In the event that a next available squad is offered in place, participants will be given the same amount of practice time as accorded to the rest of the squad.
- 19.2 In the event where the wait for rectification is more than 15 minutes on the same lanes, the affected bowler(s) will be entitled to 1 warm up shot on the lane once the fault is resolved.
- 19.3 Should a change of lane be required, the affected bowler(s) will be entitled to 2 practice throws on the lane.

### 20. PROTEST

#### 20.1 Eligibility

Protest involving eligibility or general playing rules must be submitted in writing to the Technical Committee not later than 24 hours after the game in which the infraction occurred or before prize presentation, whichever is sooner. If no written protest is filed prior to the expiration period as stated above, the game or games shall stand as bowled. Each protest under this rule shall not be construed to cover a similar or previous violation.

#### 20.2 All Other Protests

Protest involving the Leaderboard ranking must be lodged with the Tournament Committee in writing, not later than 2 hours after the completion of the attempt/squad in which the protest has arisen.  
No protests will be entertained after the submission of scores and/or presentation of prizes, whichever is earlier.

#### 20.3 Withholding of Prizes

When a protest is lodged involving the final positions in any event and pending the decisions of appeals to either SBF or ABF/IBF, the Tournament Official reserves the right to withhold presentation of prizes for the event pending the outcome of the appeal.

#### 20.4 Error in Scoring

The Tournament Officials/Bowling Centre Manager(s) immediately upon discovery of such errors will correct errors in scoring or calculation. Protests involving errors in scoring will only be entertained if such protests are brought to the attention of the Tournament Officials/Bowling Centre Manager(s) on duty on the spot.

#### 20.5 Fouls

Protest involving fouls must be brought to the attention of the Lane Marshal before the delivery of the next ball. No protest will be entertained after the bowler has made his/her second delivery of the frame.

### 21. ERRORS

Error in scoring or in calculation must be corrected by a responsible tournament official immediately, upon discovery. The Tournament director shall decide questionable errors. The time limit for registering protests on scoring errors shall be one hour from the end of the squad for each day of the tournament. Each protest under this rule must be specific in it and shall not be construed to cover a previous or similar violation.

### 22. MATTERS NOT PROVIDED FOR

The Tournament Committee whose decision shall be governed by IBF General Rules & Regulations, shall decide on any matter arising, which is not covered in these Rules & Regulations. Such a decision shall be final, subject only to an appeal to be made in writing to Singapore Bowling Federation General Council within 24 hours of the decision of the Tournament Committee.

### 23. INTERPRETATION CLAUSE

- 23.1 The Tournament Committee, reserves the right to accept or reject any entry as they deem fit.
- 23.2 Any matters arising that are not covered in these Tournament Rules & Regulations, will be decided upon by the Tournament Committee (through adoption of the IBF Playing Rules and Regulations). The decision of the Tournament Committee shall be final subject only to appeal to SBF, which must be made in writing within one-week of the decision.
